Title I Overview

2017 - 2018

Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Act provides financial assistance to school districts for programs designed to help eligible students achieve success and reach proficiency on our challenging state standards and assessment.

Title I programs are offered in all elementary and qualifying middle schools. They are coordinated at the district level by Arthena Woods who can be contacted at 469-6900, extension 509. Title I funding supports parent involvement, parent education, mathematics, reading, and school-wide projects. Additionally, Title I programs generally offer smaller classes, additional teachers and assistants, extra time for instruction, a variety of research-based teaching methods and materials, and the opportunity for Title I teachers and other staff to work closely together.

The district and each Title I school has its own Parent Involvement Policy and Compact, which is an agreement between the school and the home to promote student achievement. At the beginning of each school year, the documents are reviewed to determine how to improve them. They can be viewed at the school's website, at the fall Title I meeting, or a parent can request a copy. Parents are encouraged to make comments or suggestions and give them to their principal.

At Kingsbury Elementary, our Title I allocation is primarily used to fund additional positions in order to provide academic intervention and support. The remaining funds are used to provide parent workshops, reading and math technology programs for student practice, instructional materials, and professional development for our staff.
